Communication



Seesaw will once again be our primary form of communication with you from the classroom this year. It is a great way to stay in touch with your child's learning and watch their progress in real time.

Chromebooks

There is always some discussion amongst students and parents about the need for chromebooks in Years 3 and 4. The purchase of a chromebook is completely optional. There are a small number of Year 3 and 4 students who have their own. This year each class, including our newest Year 2/3 class, will have 11 chromebooks and 5 ipads for students to use. If your child does have their own chromebook, they will require a BYOD permissions form. Once returned, their device can be set up for use at school. Throughout Term 1 Kārearea students will be learning about digital citizenship - appropriate and responsible use of devices and appropriate consequences for misuse.

Sunhats

In Terms 1 and 4 it is compulsory for students to wear the school uniform sunhat in the playground. Our rule is 'No hat, no play' to enforce how serious we are about sun protection! If your child does not have a hat please purchase a new one from Metrographics for \$16.00.

Handwriting Book

In the Kārearea Team we have had great success with using pre-printed handwriting books with students. Your child will be assessed in week 1 to work out the best book for them. Your account will then be charged \$4 for this stationery item. If you would rather your child did not have this book, please let their class teacher know. The alternative is for them to copy off the whiteboard into an exercise book.

Homework

You can support your child at home with learning their basic facts, spelling words and by encouraging regular reading. From time to time there may be special activities your child is asked to complete as part of a classroom investigation. Your child's teacher will let you know the routines and expectations in more detail.

If parents are looking for additional maths homework, this year we will be using Studyladder. All children will have accounts they can access at home and at school. More information will be covered in the Meet the Teachers sessions.
